

Logan County COVID-19 Update, June 20, 2023

With the COVID-19 Public Health Emergency ending on May 11th, the CDC is no longer publishing COVID-19 community level data. CDC is changing their surveillance efforts to monitor COVID-19 hospitalization and death data.

This week, the CDC continues to list Logan County's COVID-19 hospitalization admission level as Low. We have a widget on our website at www.loganhealthohio.gov where you can easily check the COVID-19 hospitalization admission level for any county in the U.S.

The community is recommended to:

- Stay up to date with COVID-19 vaccines.
- Maintain <u>ventilation improvements.</u>
- Avoid contact with people who have suspected or confirmed COVID-19.
- Follow recommendations for <u>isolation</u> if you have suspected or confirmed COVID-19.
- Follow the recommendations for what to do if you are exposed to someone with COVID-19.
- If you are at <u>high risk of getting very sick</u>, talk with a healthcare provider about additional prevention actions.

If you identify any clusters of COVID-19 cases, we recommend you take measures to prevent any further spread. The Logan County Health District strongly recommends everyone to be vigilant in their prevention efforts. If you or a loved one is sick, stay home. Maintain good indoor air quality. Follow isolation and quarantine guidelines when they apply to you and your family. Have a supply of COVID-19 tests available in your home in case anyone gets ill. Get yourself and your family fully vaccinated against COVID-19.

The Logan County Health District has COVID-19 vaccinations available for all eligible age groups, including those that have yet to get their first COVID-19 vaccination. It's never too late to get the vaccine.
