



Nursing Division

There are over 100 communicable and reportable disease that are followed at the local level for the Ohio Department of Health. Logan County Health District investigates an average of 250-300 cases per year and has seen an increase in the total number of cases over the past 5 years.






184 cases of Hep C diagnosed over the past 5 years. Rates have increased by 41% during this time period.

The average cost to treat Hepatitis C can range from \$26,400 to \$94,800. LCHD is supportive of community services to reduce the incidence of Hepatitis C.


