

Lot Split Program

On January 1, 2015, the Ohio Department of Health (ODH) adopted a statewide private sewage system code. Contained in the rules is a requirement that any person proposing a new lot must receive approval from the local health department. Unless able to connect to public sanitary sewer, all new lots must use soil absorption as the means for final sewage treatment while meeting all the required isolation distances for property lines, water wells, sewage lines, structures, and driveways. The Logan County Health District (LCHD) requires all proposed new lots to first be reviewed by the closest sewer district to determine the availability of public sewers. All new lots unable to receive access to sewer must have a soil evaluation conducted for approval by the LCHD. The LCHD has determined that any lot that is over five (5) acres in size is exempt from the soil evaluation requirement and LCHD review. On August 1, 2022, the LCHD instituted its Lot Split Program after consulting with local surveyors, engineers, the Logan, Champaign, Union Regional Planning Commission and the county offices of the Building Authority, Sewer District and Auditor. Monkeypox Vaccine

The Logan County Health District received a limited supply of doses of the JYNNEOS Monkeypox vaccine. Doses are offered to those with a high degree of exposure to someone diagnosed with Monkeypox and people at higher risk of being exposed to Monkeypox. Those at higher risk of being exposed to Monkeypox include:

- · People who know one of their sexual partners has been diagnosed with Monkeypox in the past two (2) weeks.
- · People who had multiple sexual partners in the past two (2) weeks in an area with known Monkeypox.
- People whose jobs may expose them to Orthopoxvruses. If you have any questions, call (937) 592-9040.




Syphilis Outbreak

Recently, there has been an increase in Logan County's syphilis cases, with five (5) cases reported in 2022. This follows a similar increase in 2021, when seven (7) cases were reported. From 2012-2020, Logan County averaged less than two (2) cases per year. Because of this continued increase in syphilis cases, the Ohio Department of Health (ODH) has classified Logan County as having a syphilis outbreak. Syphilis has been on the rise in Ohio for a few years now and was typically seen in the state's larger, more metropolitan and urban areas. However, during the last two (2) years, increases in syphilis cases have been seen more in Ohio's rural areas. Logan County is not the only rural area seeing an increase nor the only rural area classified as having an outbreak by ODH

Naloxone Distribution

During the third quarter of this year, our Naloxone Education and Distribution program made a huge push. A total of 367 individuals were trained on how to use Naloxone and the signs and symptoms of an opioid overdose. The program also distributed 424 Naloxone kits to those that were trained. Naloxone kits include two (2) 4mg doses of Narcan, a face shield, and a pair of gloves.
