


COVID-19 Situational Report

Ohio: 904,889 Total; 786,996 Confirmed; 117,893 Probable; Ohio Confirmed Deaths: 11,538

Logan County: 2,310 Confirmed + 981 Probable = 3,291 Total Cases. Of those 3,291 cases, 2,979 are presumed recovered*. | Deaths: 39 | Active Cases: 273





Ohio's Vaccination Program – A Phased Approach

GOALS Save lives and slow the spread of the virus. In the early vaccination phase, supply will be limited. The speed at which Ohio will move through the phases is largely dependent upon the number of vaccine doses available.

PHASE 1	PHASE 2	PHASE 3 - 4
Supply Limited Vaccine is available in limited supply for specific critical populations. Ohio will focus on vaccinating those most at risk, as well essential healthcare workers and personnel caring for COVID-19 patients. Vaccines will not yet be available for all Ohioans.	Supply Increasing Vaccine is increasing and available for other specific critical populations who choose to be vaccinated. Vaccines will not yet be available for all Ohioans.	Widely Available Once the vaccine is widely available, Ohio will continue to strategically vaccinate Ohioans if they choose. During these phases, vaccines will begin to be available to all Ohioans.



Ohio's Vaccination Program Average Weekly Phase 1B Vaccinations

Each week, Ohio receives approximately 140,000 doses of COVID-19 vaccines to use on Ohioans in Phase 1B. With 2.2 million Ohioans in this group, the weekly impact gradually helps Ohio on the road back.



The graphic above reflects 2.2 million Ohioans, with each figure representing 10,000 Ohioans. The orange figures represent the 140,000 doses received in one week, and the blue figures represent the remaining Ohioans in Phase 1B.

ACTIONS COMPLETED SINCE LAST SITUATIONAL REPORT:

- Continue receiving COVID-19 Vaccine Doses from Moderna or Pfizer (approx. 100 doses per week). Continue distribution of vaccine doses to those in Phase 1A and began vaccinating those in 1B of ODH's Vaccine Distribution plan via scheduled clinics at LCHD office. - Began a COVID-19 Vaccine waiting list. To register for the waiting list, visit www.loganhealth.org.
- Two other COVID-19 Vaccine Providers began vaccinations in Logan County:
 - **Mary Rutan Hospital:** Mary Rutan Hospital follows the Ohio Department of Health guidelines in vaccine distribution and will be scheduling appointments for the current phase/included populations. To be added to the scheduling que, please call (937) 592-8805. Information on COVID-19 vaccines is also available at www.maryrutan.org and will be updated as changes in vaccine rollout occur.
 - **Kroger Pharmacy:** Customers should visit www.kroger.com/ohiocovidvaccine or call the Kroger COVID-19 vaccine helpline at (866) 211-5320 for the latest information on vaccine availability in the area. Kroger will only be providing vaccines to the current phase/included populations. All COVID-19 vaccines will require an appointment via www.kroger.com/ohiocovidvaccine or (866) 211-5320.
- Began planning for possible joint vaccination clinics with Community Health and Wellness Partners of Logan County. More information coming soon.
- Held flu and other immunization clinics by appointment only. Call (937) 651-6186 with questions or to schedule.
- Continued monitoring of local and regional hospital bed situation as well as regional hospital census data.
- Continued to receive contact tracing assistance from ODH.
- Environmental Health staff continues to assist community planners to make indoor events as safe as possible.
- ODH continues accepting ALL retail and mask complaints.

- Continued to provide additional programs and services including vital statistics (birth & death certificates), WIC, food inspections, immunizations (limited and by appointment only), TB Testing (by appointment only), Narcan distribution, newborn visits (via phone), OCTF program and CMH program.

LIAISON:

- Unified Command (EMA, MRH & LCHD) continued to meet on a weekly basis.
- LCHD staff meets with school administrators and school nurses to provide guidance on a weekly and as-needed basis.
- Continue to attend weekly calls with Governor DeWine and ODH to understand new orders and guidance as well as weekly calls with ODH for vaccine guidance.

LOGISTICS:

- Tested carbon dioxide levels, promoting fresh air exchange and indoor air quality in schools, businesses and churches.
- Continued prioritized contact tracing by contacting only the positive case and giving instruction for the positive case to complete their own contact tracing using providing written guidance.
- Continued using automated one-calls to notify positive cases of test results and isolation & contact tracing instructions.
