

Basic Steps to Follow to Open a New Food Facility

Construction may only begin after all applicable building and plumbing permits have been attained and the plans have been approved in writing by the health district. A food license application will not be processed until a Certificate of Occupancy is issued by the Logan County Building Authority (LCBA).

- 1. Obtain any necessary zoning approvals from the township, village or city.
- 2. If a city water supply is not accessible, a well may need to be approved for public consumption by the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (OEPA, 937-285-6357).
- 3. If a city sewer system is not accessible, a sewage system must be approved either by the OEPA or the Logan County Health District (937-651-6206).
- 4. All new or existing structural, electrical, and HVAC systems must be approved prior to occupancy by the Logan County Building Authority (937-592-7473).
- 5. Plumbing construction approval for commercial buildings comes from the Logan County Health District's Plumbing Inspector (937-651-6195).
- 6. The local fire authority must be contacted for a site visit to determine that the facility is in compliance with the state fire code.
- 7. A food facility plan review application and fee must be submitted to the Logan County Health District (loganhealth.org > Food Safety Program > Food Facility Plan Review Application). A scaled diagram showing all surface finishes, equipment manufacturer names and model numbers, plumbing fixtures, a lighting plan with foot candles and a menu of foods to be sold is required for the plans to be reviewed. Following passage of the final food inspection by the LCHD the food license can be purchased.
- 8. All new food facilities are required to have each person-in-charge (manager) obtain food handler certification. For Risk Level 3 and 4 facilities at least one person must obtain manager certification in food protection.

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
